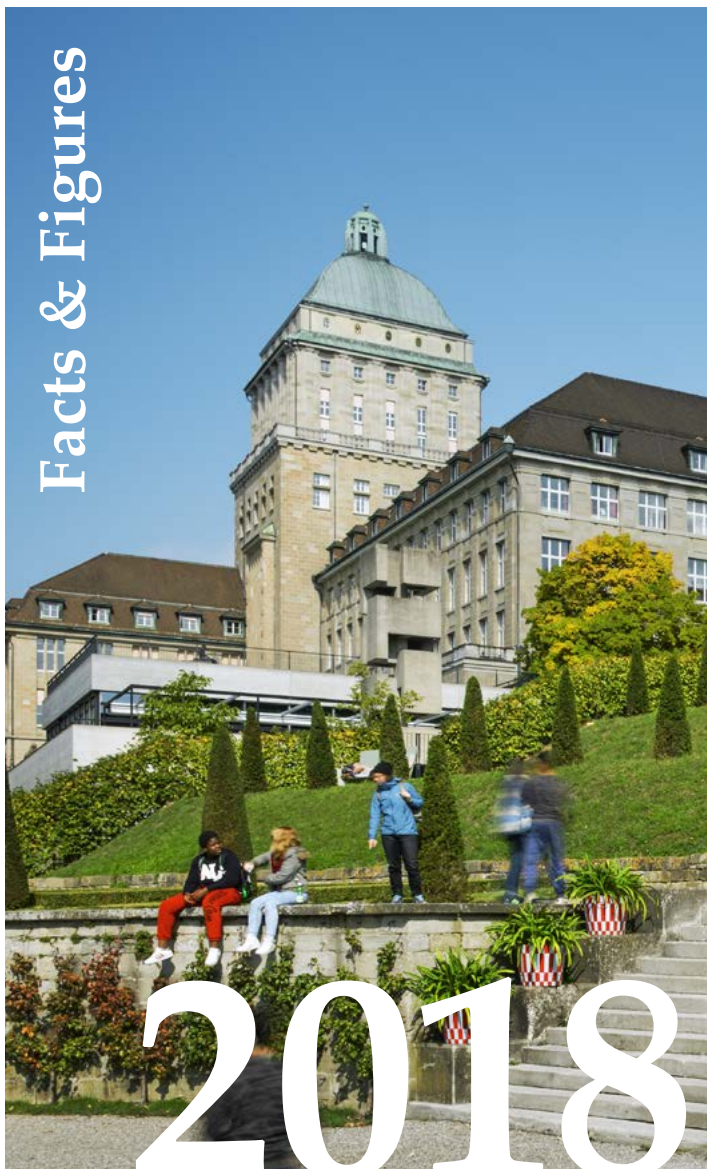

University of Zurich



Founded in 1833

The University of Zurich (UZH) was founded in 1833. With a current enrollment of over 25,800 students, UZH is now the largest university in Switzerland, and with around 100 subject areas on offer, it boasts the most comprehensive academic program in the country.



Studying at UZH

The University's seven faculties offer a wide variety of Bachelor's, Master's and PhD programs. Around 6,000 academic staff (including 685 professors) research and teach in around 140 departments and clinics.



Research-Based Teaching

As a research university, teaching at UZH is inspiring and research-based, and junior researchers are encouraged and supported in their careers.



Innovation

Through its spin-off ventures and partnerships, UZH encourages the transfer of knowledge into private enterprise, generating attractive employment opportunities in innovative fields.



Excellence in Medicine

The proximity between medical research and the clinical services provided in the University's four hospitals translates into first-rate medical care for the general population.



Twelve Nobel Prizes

The University's international standing is reflected in the many renowned academic distinctions conferred upon its members over the years, including 12 Nobel Prizes, one of which went to Albert Einstein.



Among the World's Best

UZH's excellent reputation as a research institution is mirrored in the global rankings. In the 2018 Shanghai Ranking UZH was ranked 54th in the world.



Public Outreach

All those with a thirst for knowledge are welcome at UZH. The University's museums, libraries and a variety of events and lectures are free and open to the public.



Continuing Education

UZH's continuing education programs ensure knowledge is shared between academia and practitioners.

Faculty Research Priority Programs

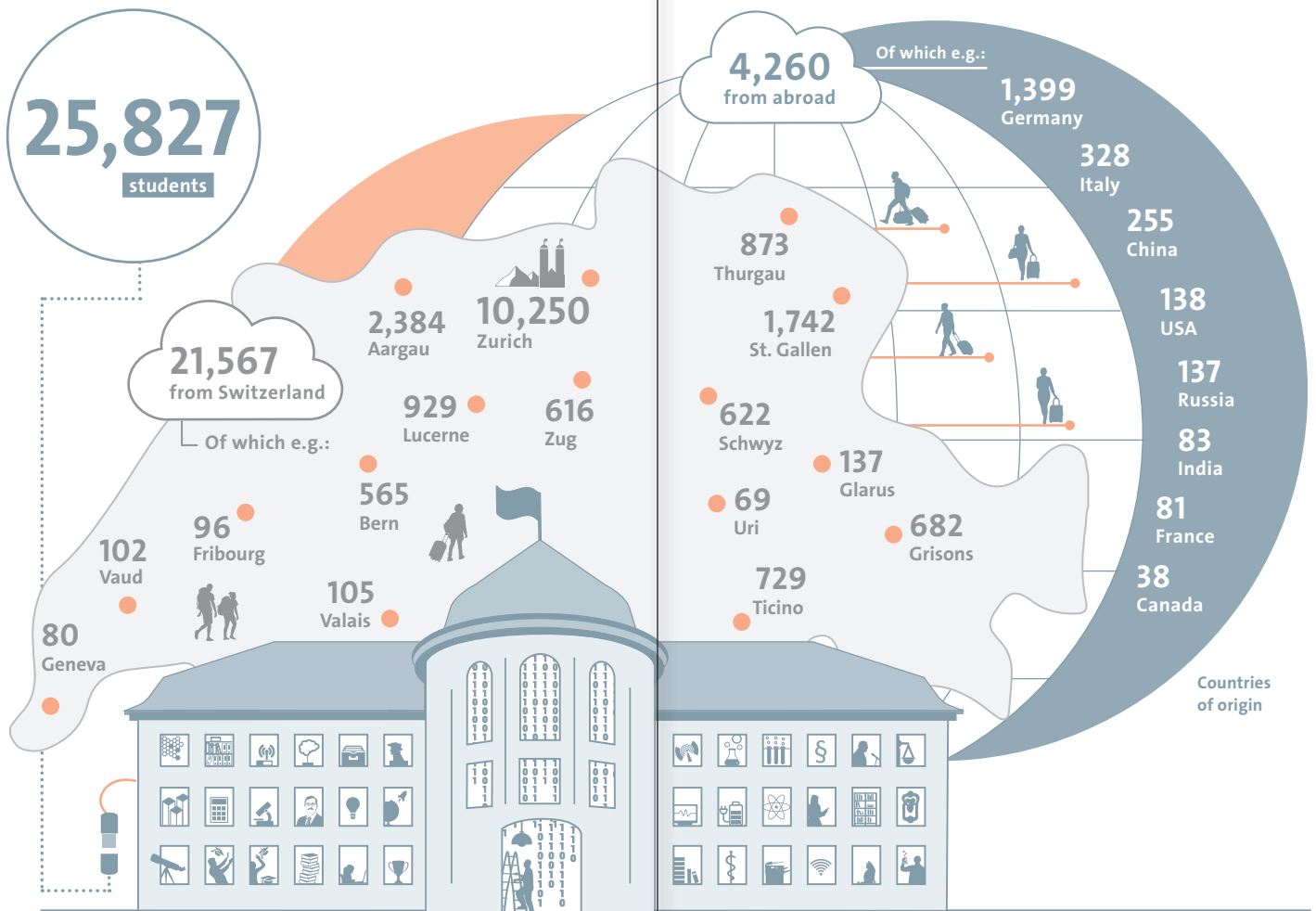

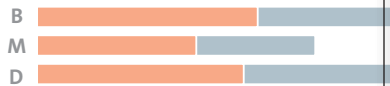

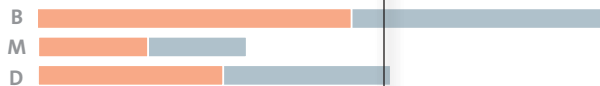

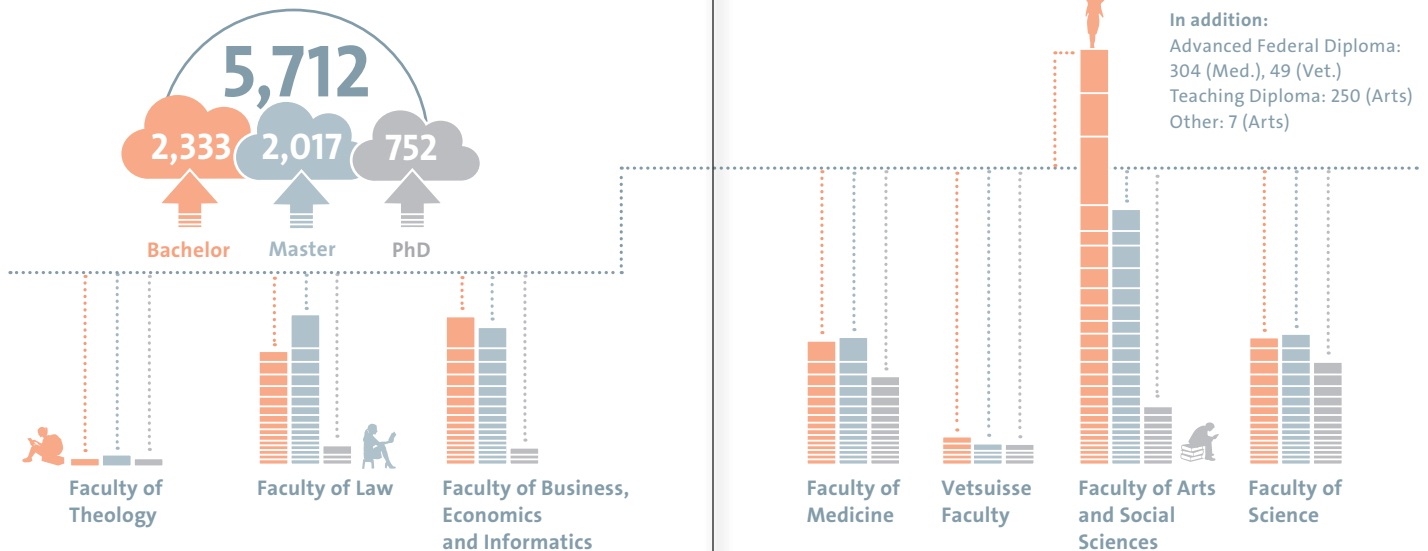
Five Most Popular Major Subjects



Five Most Popular Minor Subjects



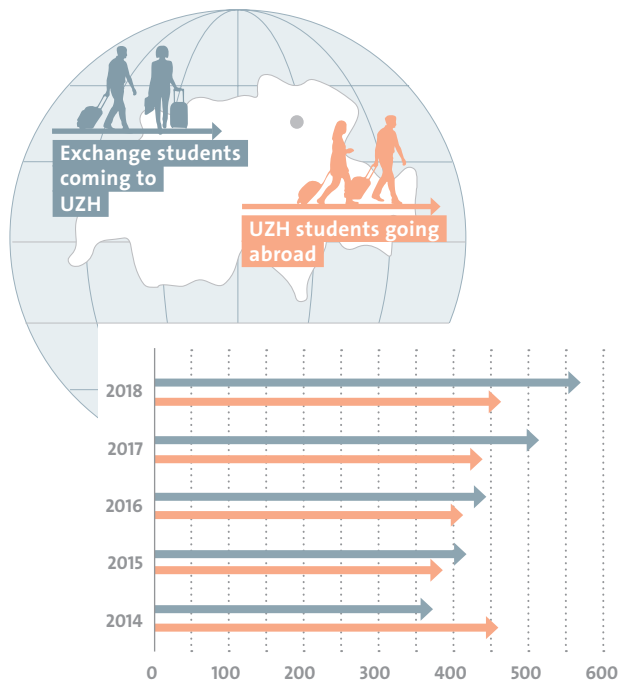
Degrees Awarded Fall Semester 2018

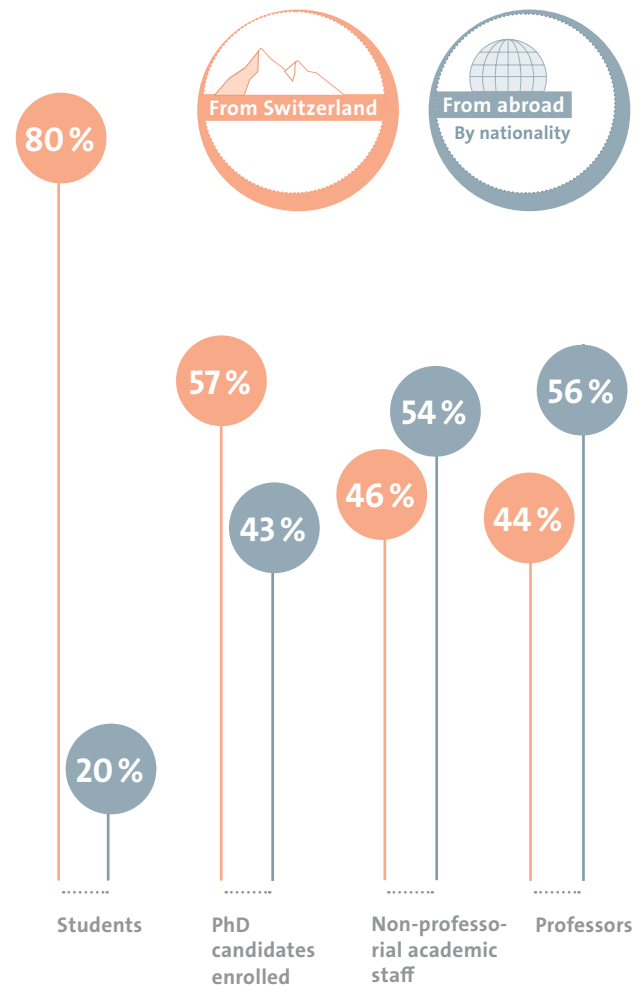

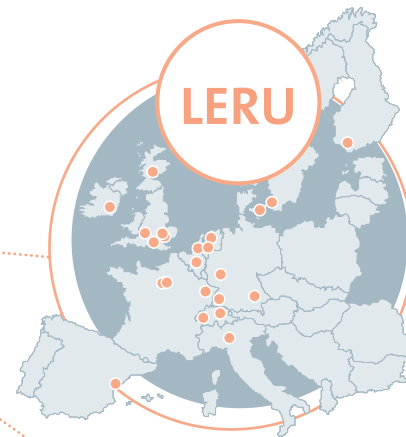
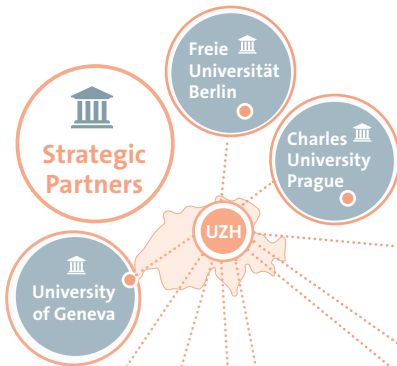

UZH has been a member of the League of European Research Universities (LERU) since 2006. LERU is a network of 23 research-intensive universities from 12 different European countries.



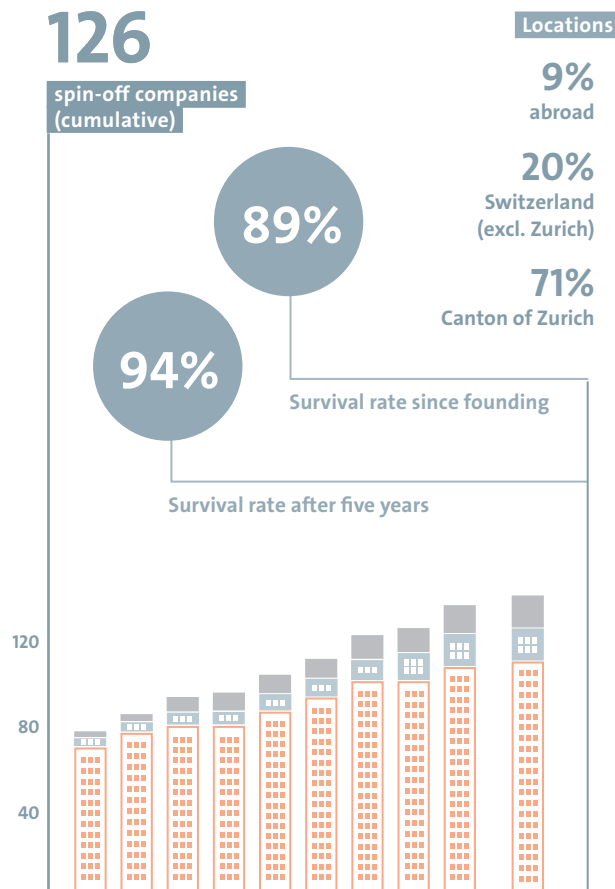

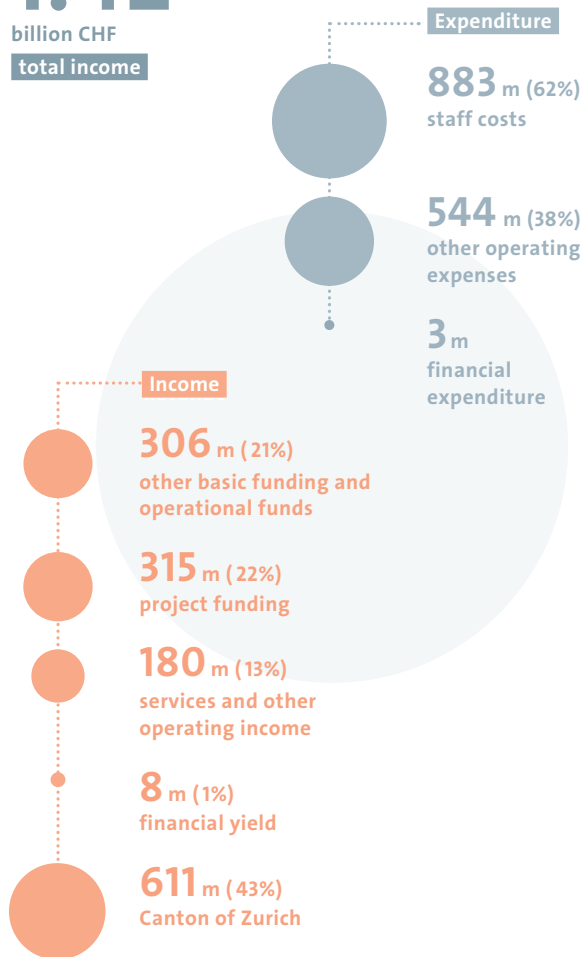

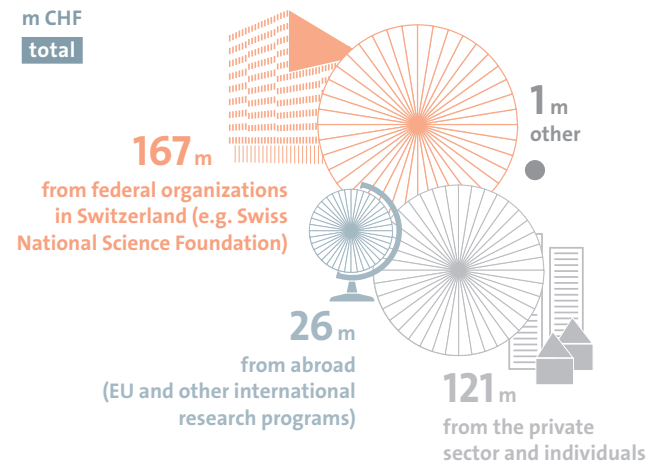

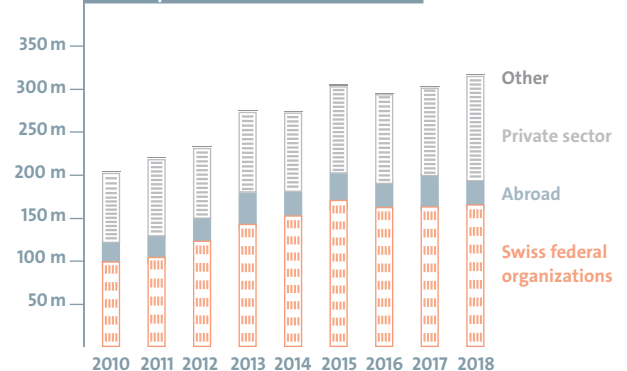

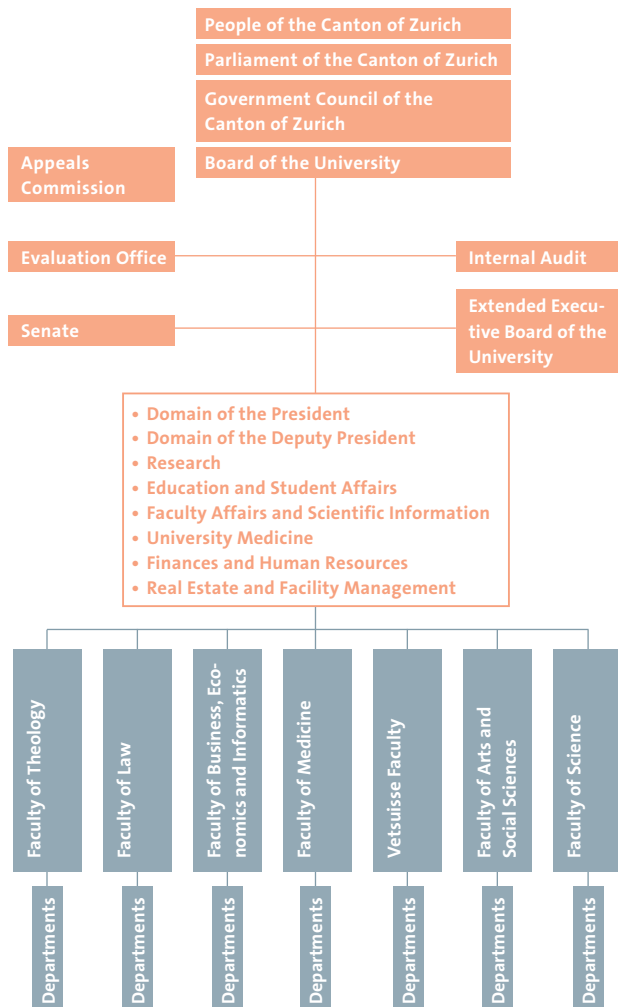
