Prof. Dr. Amal Suleiman El-Obeidi, University of Benghazi

Professor El-Obeidi is Associate Professor of Comparative Politics in the Department of Political Science, Faculty of Economics, University of Benghazi, Libya. She served as Dean of Faculty of Economics at the University of Benghazi in 1999–2001 and as head of Department of Political Science in 2006–2008. In her research she mainly focuses on security topics, especially in the Mediterranean; gender issues; and public policies.
