



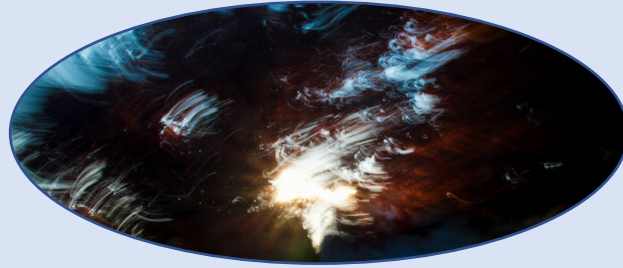

#### **Ethnographic Publishing Workshop on Book Series: “Ethnographic Innovations, South Asian Perspectives”**

This ethnographic publishing workshop introduces the aims and foci of the Routledge book series: *Ethnographic Innovations, South Asian Perspectives*, edited by Niharika Banerjea, Rohit Dasgupta and Paul Boyce. The workshop will open up wider questions about the nature and purpose of ethnographic knowledge and writing. The experts will consider issues involved in writing ethnography for publication and/or other purposes. This will involve examinations of boundaries between fact and fiction in ethnographic practice alongside considerations of the temporalities in ethnography –it being oriented to past, present and future in complex ways. Finally in the workshop participants will engage some writing exercises and reflexive discussions.

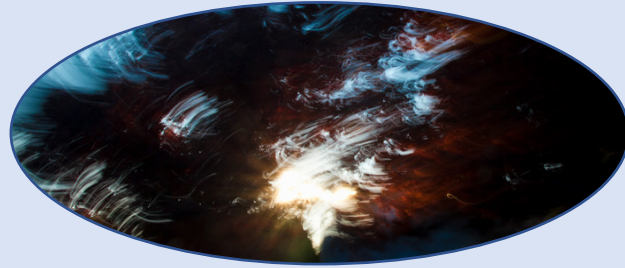
