Ausführungen zum Studienprogramm

- Empfohlener Studienbeginn: Herbstsemester
- Wahlbereich von 36 ECTS: lässt Schwerpunktsetzung zu
- Max. 6 ECTS Credits fachfremde Wahlmodule
- Anerkennung von jur. Praktika im Umfang von max. 6 ECTS als rechtswissenschaftliche Wahlmodule
- Masterarbeit im Umfang von 12 ECTS
- Wiederholungs- und Fehlversuchsregeln:
 - Pflichtmodule: zweimal wiederholbar
 - Wahlpflicht- und Wahlmodule: gemeinsames Fehlversuchsmaximum von 8 Fehlversuchen
 - Fachfremde Wahlmodule: Fehlversuche werden nicht berücksichtigt
- Alle Module werden in chronologischer Reihenfolge berücksichtigt
- Abschlussgrad: Master of Law UZH



Tipps eines Studierenden

- Studium frühzeitig planen!
 - Insbesondere beachten, dass Wiederholungs- und Vertiefungskurs Strafrecht/Strafverfahrensrecht 2-semesterig ist
 - Allfällige Mobilität ebenfalls frühzeitig planen
- Sich frühzeitig über Wahlmodule informieren (da gewisse Module nicht jedes Jahr angeboten werden) und gewisse Module aufeinander aufbauen
- Gewisse (Pflicht-)Module können erhöhten Aufwand bedeuten – übrigen Module sollten entsprechend geplant werden

Minor Recht auf Masterstufe

- Zulassungsvoraussetzungen: Mindestens 30 rechtswissenschaftliche ECTS auf Bachelorstufe erbracht
- Studienprogramm: freie Wahl im Umfang von 30 ECTS aus dem gesamten Masterangebot der RWF
- Wiederholungs- und Fehlversuchsregeln:
 - Es gilt ein Maximum von insgesamt fünf Fehlversuchen
- Studienabschluss des Major-Studienprogramms auf Masterstufe, das mit dem Minor-Studienprogramm Recht auf Masterstufe kombiniert wird.

Master of Law UZH International and Comparative Law (ENG)



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General Information 1/2

- The Master of Law UZH International and Comparative Law offers students the opportunity to continue their studies in English and to supplement their legal skills with a view to an international work environment.
- The International and Comparative Law study program comprises two variants:
- Students with a Bachelor of Law from a Swiss university complete compulsory elective modules worth 48 ECTS credits, elective modules worth 30 ECTS credits and the compulsory master's thesis module worth 12 ECTS credits.
- Students with a Bachelor of Law from a foreign university, on the other hand, take an additional compulsory module "Introduction to Swiss Law", and only need 24 ECTS credits from elective modules.
- Elective modules can be chosen from the entire English-language range of courses offered by the Faculty of Law at Master's level.



General Information 2/2

- Program can be started in spring or fall semester
- No ECTS credits from other faculties/language courses can be recognized
- Recognition of legal internships in the amount of max. 6 ECTS as law electives: in English only
- Master's thesis of 12 ECTS: in English only.
- The compulsory modules can be repeated twice.
- A joint maximum of 13 failed attempts applies to the elective and elective modules. As long as the maximum number of failed attempts has not been reached, the individual compulsory and elective modules can be repeated as often as you like, provided they are offered again, and can be substituted within the respective pool.
- Failing modules that are not offered by the RWF is not taken into account in the maximum number of failed attempts.



Admission

- Bachelor of Law UZH or a Bachelor of Law from a Swiss university
- Bachelor of Law of equivalent degree from a foreign university
- Sufficient knowledge of English: Please check with the Admissions Office UZH:

What is special about this Program?

- Provides international and comparative law courses, with the ability to focus on various topics from various Elective Modules you can choose from.
- Within core elective modules one has freedom of choice based on number of modules available each semester.
- Diverse and Rich learning experience: Exploring modern topics in international law, written papers, presentations, workshops, Moot Courts and exchange programs. Which gives you the ability to participate in active learning and obtain new skills such as legal drafting and research while studying.
- Master's thesis can be written as part of the Moot Court in the seminars (in English only). For more information contact the chosen moot court coordinator for organisational matters.
- Going beyond the classical academic learning; meeting international students and increasing the social and cultural engagement of your college experience.
- Topics in both International and comparative law are diverse, covering and discussing up to date issues.



Exchange Opportunities

- Up to 45 ECTS credits recognizable from another university, must be taken in English
- **Swiss mobility:** Possible at all Swiss law schools.
- **International mobility:**
 - SEMP(Erasmus) agreements in Europe
 - Faculty agreements with non-European universities
 - Other bilateral agreements of the UZH
- **Summer/ Winter Schools**
