Globalization in a complex world

Once heralded as an unstoppable and positive force, globalization is today facing pushback on multiple fronts due to growing great power rivalry and weaponized connectivity, increasing global threats (e.g., pandemics and climate change), and rising inequality. International fields that were previously viewed as relatively separate – like trade and investment, national security, health and the environment – are colliding. Global governance regimes are multiplying, fragmenting, and converging in a bid to grapple with these challenges. How can we make sense of these developments and what do they mean for the future of global regimes such as international trade?
